

A Chara

The Peninsula Park was officially opened by the President of Ireland in 2022, as one of the only two public parks in Kenmare which are owned by Kerry County Council. It is important that the public have easy and safe access to the Public Parks from the town of Kenmare and that emergency vehicles also have multiple access options.

Currently the 13.7 acres at the Peninsula Park is accessed via. "a right of way of only sixteen feet in width on foot and with or without animals or vehicles mechanical or otherwise along and over the passage from the public road at the pier head Kenmare".

This is a very narrow access way for the park and for health and safety reasons an alternative access point should be secured by the Council to ensure in the event of the pier road being inaccessible to emergency vehicles that an alternative is available.

Currently the Council has a right of way that goes part of way to the Peninsula Park towards Market Street, marked yellow on the attached map. During the negotiation to purchase the Peninsula land the council was granted by one of the other parties involved.


"a right of way over the part of its (the other parties) land coloured yellow on the composite map"

This right of way appears to stop at the gate near the stone circle. This legal right of way, in favour of the Council is not currently usable as there appears to be debris on it. The Council should use the powers at its disposal to clear the debris off its right of way.

The Council should also include the current right of way towards Market Street in the Kenmare Town Development Plan, as previous plans had shown this access, with the aspiration, again using the powers at its disposal, to secure the remaining access needed towards the town so that the Peninsula Park can be safely enjoyed for generations to come.
